Call to Order and Welcome | JC Valeros

School District Liaison Report | Danielle Connelly

There has been a School Board meeting and Operations and Education Committee Meeting since the last meeting PAC meeting. Highlights from those meetings include:

- Update on Early Assessment Program. Early assessment in Kindergarten is resulting in better communication year to year. Seeing good results with assessment and intervention.
- Update about new tentative Fraser River Elementary school adjacent to the Middle School. Working on concept plan, funding not yet approved. Plan is a campus style urban design on SD land. 600 capacity. Purpose build building for alternate program will also be on site. Once concept plan is submitted, we will move to next phase and hopefully secure funding.
- 3. School District is in the process of hiring a manager to focus on Child Care portfolio in alignment with Ministry.
- 4. Space and Capacity at Qayqayt: The Neighbourhood Learning Centre space at Qayqayt will be converted into classrooms. New Westminster Family Place will have to relocate. The Child Care Centre operated on site by the Purpose Society may have to relocate as well. Needs assessment is under way to determine what those families will need. Back in June, Guiding Principles (see Board notes) were proposed by School District staff and adopted by Board to address capacity issues. At the Operations Committee meeting there was a motion to review the Programs of Choice (in March 2023) as a next step to create capacity. School District Staff will report back at November 8, 2022 meeting regarding how parents will be consulted.

Questions and Discussion:

- Question from parent re: relocation of Purpose Society (Infant/Toddler and Preschool spaces) & Out of School care? Confirmed that WCAS will move to gym. Reminder that Seamless Daycare will continue.
- Comment from parent: Great that there will be consultation re: relocation of daycare. Families with children at Qayqayt and Purpose Societyhave not heard anything re: how consultation will occur. What are the # of classroom that will be needed in the next 5 years before new school opens?
- Question from parent re: decision by Trustees to target French Immersion for consideration of relocation. Consideration of programs of choice came form a recommendation from School District staff. Staff are looking at various possibilities and how students can stay in catchment.
- Comment from parent that New Westminster has limited enrichment programs (no gifted program etc.) and that French Immersion is quite new in our District. Request to please consider this.

Community Schools Report | Rick Bloudell

- Rick is now located at the Welcome Centre and managing various community projects.
- Afterschool Programs at Qayqayt currently 9 programs being offered 89 students participating.
- Wellness Centre: Virtual Parent Education Session will be on November 23, 2022 on Digital Literacy and Online Safety
- Neighbourhood Learning Programs at Qayqayt will be relocating as previously discussed. Afterschool programs hopefully continuing. WCAS and Mme Cameron working together to continue programs.

Principal and Vice-Principal Report | Suzanne Cameron and Nadia Young

- There is big excitement as the Floor Hockey Club has started at lunchtime. Over 30 students showed up. There was a staff meeting today. Teachers are signing up for clubs. Trying to figure out logistics where, how. Most of the clubs are Grades 4/5. Looking at clubs for younger children. Running/Fitness club will be starting up, likely before school.
- 2. Halloween will be coming up. Children can wear their costumes on October 31st to school. No masks or weapons.
- 3. Scolastics Book Fair coming back Oct 31-November 4. We need some parent volunteers. PAC is helping with recruitment.
- 4. Photo retakes will be on October 24
- 5. Parent and teacher interviews will occur the first week of November. Teachers will reach out and book appointments.
- 6. If you have any concerns about your child, please contact/email classroom teacher. If you don't get the response you need, please contact Mme. Cameron.

Comment from parent: Families attending the Purpose Society Child Care: families choose that child care because they live Downtown without cars and walk/cycling to the child care. To relocate outside the Downtown area would be very difficult for many. Families would appreciate consultation with families re: their needs. *School District Liaison Response:* There was no time commitment in regard to NLC at Qayqayt. In other words, no formal agreement or contract as it pertains to NLC space funding.
