- We are at the end of the budget season. Superintendent Hashlaf presented his recommendations based on feedback from students, staff, and the community at the Operations Meeting on May 2, 2023. - Priorities identified include:
 - Staffing replacements
 - Inclusive Education Supports
 - Increase social-emotional supports

- Safety and Supervision
- Indigenous Education Curriculum Supports
- Technology in Schools
- Planning for growth
- Support for increasing childcare
- Priorities that have been operationalized include:
 - 1.0 FTE Speech Language Pathologist
 - 0.5 FTE Indigenous Curriculum Staffing
 - Maintain 1 Block Climate Action Facilitator Staffing
 - Continue Diversity and Inclusion Work
 - Continue to use contingency for EA Staffing
 - \$1500 for Middle Schools for rising costs in athletics
- School District is waiting for funding for exempt Principles this may impact budget.
- Final reading for budget and approval hopefully at May 23 meeting
- Long term planning: Fraser River area elementary school business case ongoing
- School District has until June 30th to submit final budget
- 2. Presentation re: Child Care at Operations Meeting
